## OUTDOOR GREENS AVAILABILITY

The Worsley green (the “back” green) is now open for play, and will be available for practice, Thursday and Saturday pennant from now on.

The Hazell green (the “front” green) has been seeded and top dressed and it will be some time before this green will be available for play. Hopefully, the weather will be kind and assist in the growth of new grass so that it will not be too long before both outdoor greens are in full use.

## SATURDAY MIXED PENNANT

Bowls Tasmania South has decided to conduct this season's Mixed pennant as an Open Division to be played in two sections, a Blue and Red section. This means that A Grade women are now eligible for selection for the Club's Mixed (Open) pennant team. **A Grade women who wish to be considered for selection in the Mixed team are now invited to advise their intentions.**

## PENNANT HOME GAMES

Until the Hazell green is ready for play it may be necessary to schedule some Thursday and Saturday pennants matches to be played in the Indoor Centre. This will occur when it is not possible to schedule the full round of home games for a particular day on the one outdoor green. In this circumstance it will be the responsibility of the Chairperson of Selectors to decide the match to be played indoors.

All home games during the Wednesday Midweek pennant roster for 2013-14 will be played in the Indoor Centre. Bowls Tasmania South has been advised of all matters relating to the availability of our outdoor greens and has concurred with the temporary arrangements for home matches for Thursday and Saturday pennant, as well as for the use of the Indoor Centre for Midweek pennant.

## PENNANT - AVAILABILITY FOR SELECTION

Please remember that it is your responsibility to inform the selectors of any day/s on which your are not available to be considered for selection, and to do so as early as is possible. Sheets have been placed on notice boards for all pennant rosters for all pennant players to indicate the days for which they will not be available for selection.

If, at any time, you are unavailable for selection then it is essential that you inform the selectors of your Pennant teams adding your name to the unavailable list in accordance with the following:

**Men's Midweek Pennant: by Thursday afternoon**

**Men's and Mixed Saturday Pennants: by Saturday evening**

### INTERACTION WITH THE GREENKEEPER

At the Board of Management meeting on Tuesday evening (8 October) verbal complaints from the greenkeeper (David McLean) and from his employer (Doug Ollington), were discussed.

Whilst it is important to maintain friendly relations with our new greenkeeper it is imperative that all members abide by agreed protocols for any interactions between the Club and the contractor in regard to the work to be done on the outdoor greens.

These protocols have been determined through discussions between the contractor and the Board and have been designed to streamline the line management of the work. It has been agreed that the principal point of liaison between the contractor and the Board will be the Chairman of the Greens Committee.

If any member has any concerns in regard to the state of the greens, or wishes to know why certain procedures are being undertaken by the greenkeeper these questions should be put to the Chairman of the Greens Committee.

**Under no circumstances should any member approach the greenkeeper, independently of the Chairman of the Greens Committee, on any matter relating to the state of the greens, or the method of their maintenance or preparation.**

### VOLUNTEER MAINTENANCE OF THE GREENS SURROUNDS

**Congratulations** to Craig Griggs and his team of volunteers for their excellent efforts in the preparation of the surrounds of the outdoor greens. The work done on the lawn areas enhance the external environment of the Club, making for a very pleasing visual experience when entering from the car park.

Painting of the concrete surrounds of the Worsley green has been refreshed, and the peg markings on the bank repainted, also. The next major task for the group will be to conduct similar work on the Hazell green surrounds next Friday week.

### BTS NIGHT/TWILIGHT PENNANT GAMES IN THE INDOOR CENTRE

The Board of Management has endorsed, unanimously, a proposal to contact other BTS member clubs seeking their willingness to join with Kingborough Bowls Club in promoting the game of bowls to a wider audience by playing competitive pennant roster matches in the Indoor Centre.

With the growing success of the White Jack Bistro it is believed that it is time to add another dimension to the culinary experience by including the opportunity to watch competition bowls while dining. In general, though, it is an excellent opportunity to showcase our game as well as to bring more men and women into the sport (and, thus, grow our membership base).

The Board has been encouraged by the positive support of BTS, as well as unsolicited approaches from other clubs regarding the possibility of making alternative arrangements for the playing of pennant games at the Kingborough Bowls Club by transferring them to the Indoor Centre, and playing the matches on Friday night.

Letters have been sent to all BTS-affiliated clubs outlining the proposal with an invitation to explore the possible alternatives available by moving some of our home games indoors. The proposal does not limit the initiative to Men's Pennant, only, or just to a single division (i.e. Division 1).
