KBC OUTDOOR GREENS AND WATERING

Contrary to the belief of some Club members, influenced by the current speed of our outdoor greens, the greenkeeper has not applied any water to the greens, using the Club's irrigation system, since prior to the commencement of the 2014-2015 pennant season.

The lush condition of the greens and, subsequently their slow speed, is the result of a number of factors, all of which are beyond the control of our greenkeeper. Firstly, the water table is not far below the surface of the greens which is a major contributing factor when coupled with regular rainfall, as experienced of late.

A second factor is the composition of the soil of the greens, which is of a type that has the capacity for high water retention. Thirdly, proximity to Mt Wellington has the effect of causing higher rainfall in the local area, when compared with other parts of Hobart, especially the Eastern Shore.

A little patience, time and a period of hot, fine weather will do much to improve the speed of our greens.

MARKERS AND MEASURERS COURSES

It is expected that confirmation will be received, soon, in regard to Markers and Measurers courses that will be conducted in the Indoor Centre, some time early in the New Year.

Accredited Markers will be required, in future, by both Bowls South and Bowls Tasmania for their Singles Championship events. To be eligible to host such events the Club will be required to demonstrate its ability to provide enough accredited Markers to supervise play on every rink for each round of the competition.

Please consider undertaking the Markers course, not just to assist the Club but to improve your understanding of the game of bowls, also.

The Measurers course would be of great benefit for any player who plays as a three, or who aspires to play in this position. In the future, accredited Measurer will undertake most of the measuring duties currently performed by Umpires. A three, who is also an accredited Measurer, will be able to all of the measuring duties previously performed by an Umpire, especially where a close measure would have required an Umpire previously. With an accredited Measurer available on each rink would mean that an Umpire would be required only if clarification of a point of law was required, thus speeding up play immensely.

Each of these courses will require attendance for one evening only, for a period of approximately three hours. Gaining accreditation as either a Marker or a Measurer, or both, will be of significant personal benefit to you as a bowler, as well as providing you with the ability to provide valued service to the Club, and to your fellow bowlers

Please watch the noticeboards in the Clubrooms for further information about the courses, the date and time, so that you can nominate for one or both of these courses.

INCREASES TO MEMBERS' HAPPY HOUR BAR PRICES

At its most recent meeting, the Board endorsed a small increase to the Members' Happy Hour bar prices, and to a number of lines on the Functions price list. In regard to the Happy Hour prices, in particular, these have not been increased for several years and the moderate rise in prices was considered by the Board to be appropriate.

BOWLS ETIQUETTE SHOWING RESPECT FOR YOUR DIRECT OPPONENT AFTER THE COMPETION OF A MATCH

All bowlers are reminded that showing respect for your direct opponent, after the completion of a pennant match (and his/her team), is just as an important bowls etiquette issue as your behaviour on the green during the match.

This means spending time with your direct opponent in the clubrooms after the match, sharing refreshments and participating in a friendly discourse, no matter what the outcome of game on the green.

If it is essential that you must leave immediately after the completion of the match, due to a prior personal commitment, ensure that you make this known to your opponent **prior to the commencement of play.** Do not leave this important piece of information until after the completion of play, as it may be taken as an offence by your opponent/s, especially if your team happens to lose the match.

All of us need to ensure that all of our behaviours, on and off the green, promotes our Club as a friendly and sociable club, honouring the efforts of our opponents.

END-OF-YEAR BOOKINGS OF CLUB FACILITIES FOR PRIVATE FUNCTIONS

Bookings for a good number of private functions have been accepted by the Club up to and including Sunday 21 December. Sometimes this may create a little inconvenience to Club members (i.e. the Indoor Centre not being available for use for practice) but it is more important to understand that each private function is injecting revenue into the Club, "outside" money that will assist in the provision of enhanced facilities for the Club's members.

CHANGES TO ACCESS TO INDOOR CENTRE/ GREENKEEPER'S SHED

Ongoing issues with security of the Clubrooms has required changes to access arrangements to the buildings. The key safe outside the entrance to the Indoor Centre (beside the control box for the irrigation system) has been activated, and the key to the entrance door to the security alarm code pad (where the jacks and mats are kept) is now stored inside the key safe. Also available in the key safe is the key to the Greenkeeper's Shed.

The access code to the key safe in the Indoor Centre (in which the key to the cupboard, in reception area, is kept, has been changed also.

Volunteers who require the access code for either of the two key safes should obtain these codes from either the Secretary or the IBC Director.

As with all security access codes relating to areas of the Clubrooms, these codes are supplied to authorised persons on the understanding that they will be kept confidential, and not shared with anyone else.

KEY REGISTER

The Secretary is creating a register of Club members authorised to have keys to areas of the clubrooms (i.e. master key, key to the Indoor Centre) to ensure that keys are held by members authorised by the Board to have such keys. If you hold any keys to that provide access to any areas of the clubrooms please ensure that you make this known to the Secretary. If you have in your possession keys to the clubrooms for which you believe that you are no longer authorised to hold, please pass hand these to the Secretary.
