FRANK PENIGUEL VISITS KINGBOROUGH

Frank Peniguel, a member of the Daylesford Bowls Club in Victoria, has spent the past year travelling throughout Australia, playing bowls along the way to establish a benchmark of a total number of different bowls clubs played at during a twelve month period, for inclusion in the Guinness Book of World Records. To achieve his aim, Frank plays a singles match of ten ends against a member of the host club, which also supplies a marker and two other members of the club to act as witnesses to verify the legitimacy of his claim. Photographic evidence of his presence at the club is also taken.

On Tuesday 30 December Frank visited Kingborough and, due to heavy rain, played ten ends in the Indoor Centre against the Secretary (Peter Kirby) - we won't elaborate on the outcome, except to say that Frank enjoyed a very good game. Thanks to Craig Griggs (Marker) and Leoni and Geoff Price, who acted as witnesses to the staging of the event.

Frank was on the final leg of his journey around Australia, having left Tasmania to the last of the states and territories to visit. Frank planned to return to Devonport, via the East Coast, calling into bowls clubs along the way, before returning to his home in Daylesford in mid-January. Kingborough was the 649th bowls club he had played at, at the time of his visit.

TASMANIAN INDOOR OPEN SINGLES EOI SUCCESS

In response to a Kingborough Board of Management initiative, requesting Bowls Tasmania to allocate the Tasmanian Indoor Open Singles Championships to the Kingborough Indoor Bowls Centre for the years 2015 to 2017, the Bowls Tasmania Board invited Tasmania's three indoor centres (Burnie, Kings Meadows and Kingborough) to submit an Expression of Interest in staging the indoor singles for the years 2015 to 2017, addressing a set of selection criteria.

At its December 17 meeting, the Bowls Tasmania Board has accepted Kingborough's EOI submission and the Kingborough Board will now commence planning for the 2015 event, to be staged over the first weekend in May (2 -3 May, 2015). The most important task will be to secure sufficient sponsorship to cover Bowls Tasmania's contribution to the cost of the four bowlers (2 males and 2 females) who will qualify to represent Tasmania at the 2015 Australian Open Indoor Singles, to be played in August.

The Kingborough Board's aim is to achieve incremental increases in player participation, for both men and women, for each of the three years, beginning with greater participation in 2015 compared Kingborough's first involvement in 2014.

The Kingborough Board will rely, heavily, on its members volunteering their time to assist in the Club to conducting this event to a very high standard.

KBC SINGLES CHAMPIONSHIPS

All bowling members, male and female, are requested to ensure that they make the playing of their Club Singles Championship matches their highest priority, if they are still "live" in their respective Club Singles event/s.

Women's Singles events must be completed before 4 March, 2015, and Men's Singles events before 16 March, 2015 to ensure that the Club can enter its representatives in all of the Bowls Tasmania South Champion of Champions Singles events to be staged this season.

POOR BEHAVIOUR AND LANGUAGE

The Bowls Tasmania South Board is gravely concerned with the unacceptable behaviour of some players at BTS Championship events, and in Pennant competitions. The Board has advised all clubs that swearing, over-exuberant behaviour (such as "over the top" celebrations and encouragement of teammates), as well as conduct unbecoming, or any other behaviour that brings the game of bowls into disrepute will not be tolerated in future. The Bowls Tasmania South Board has further resolved that it will take action against any players undertaking such behaviour.

BTS 2014-2015 CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS SINGLES

Bowls Tasmania South intends to conduct its Women's Champion of Champions Singles events from 4 to 6 March, 2015, and its Men's Champion of Champions Singles events from 16 to 20 March. KBC representatives need to be known prior to the commencement of each event.

There will be no BTS C of C Pairs this season.

CHEMSEARCH CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS OPEN THREE BOWL PAIRS

Through the initiative of Craig Griggs sponsorship has been obtained to support the staging of a Champion of Champions Three Bowl Triples event in the Indoor Centre in early April. An invitation has been sent to all clubs in Southern Tasmania inviting their 2014-2015 club pairs champions to enter the Kingborough event.

This event does not have official status with Bowls Tasmania South, yet, but it does provide club pairs champions to test their skills against similarly qualified pairs champions from other clubs.

The Club is grateful to Craig for obtaining the sponsorship from Chemsearch, which has enabled the allocation of prize money to support this event. Watch for more details.

MARKER'S COURSE MONDAY 9 FEBRUARY

Planning is underway to conduct the first of the Marker's courses in Southern Tasmania in the Kingborough Indoor Bowls Centre on Monday 9 February. At the time of publication of this issue of the Club Newsletter full details of the course (i.e. start time/duration) were not available but it is safe to assume that this will be held during the evening to enable those with work commitments to attend the course.

Although this course will be open to all bowlers in Southern Tasmania, our Club requires a good number of Bowls Australia-accredited Markers to support the staging of the Tasmanian Indoor Open Singles event, therefore all members of the Club, male and female, are strongly encouraged to attend the course.

Why is Marker accreditation necessary? Firstly, because the role of Marker for singles matches, from 1 January this year, has undergone significant change. The traditional role of the Marker as being silent and "unseen", unless asked a question by the player in possession of the mat, is no more. From now on the Marker will take on a much more active role in play, especially after each player has delivered his/her second bowl. From that point of each end the Marker will provide information spontaneously, without being questioned by the player in possession of the mat, informing the players of the situation at the head (i.e. using coloured "paddles" to indicate which player has the shot, and the number of shots up), and any other information considered by the Marker to be relevant to give the players a good understanding of the "state of play".

Secondly, all singles competitions in future, above club level, will require accredited Markers.

A form on which to register your interest in participating in the Marker's Course on Monday 9 February is on display on the Pennant noticeboard (under the television in bar).

WORLD BOWLS AMENDS THE LAWS OF BOWLS

Amendments to the Laws of the Sport of Lawn Bowls (Crystal Mark 3), endorsed by World Bowls during the Commonwealth Games in 2014, came into effect on 1 January, 2015. Some of the changes are "cosmetic" in that some of the laws have been renumbered and grouped so that laws pertaining to a particular aspect of the game are together, in sequence.

Other changes to the laws have had an immediate effect on play. These are:

- 1. Position on the mat prior to delivery: players standing on the mat, preparing to deliver a bowl (or jack), must have at least part of one foot on the mat (before 1 January the player was required to have the whole of one foot, at least, on the mat). There has been no change to the position of the feet at the point of delivery of the bowl (part of one foot, at least, must be on or over the mat).
- 2. Who keeps the card/adjusts the scoreboard? The scorecard, and the adjustment of the scoreboard, are now the responsibility of the seconds of each team.
- 3. Playing one short: In any game of fours, where one team is a player short, either for the whole game or for a number of ends during the game, the players of that team will play two bowls each (6 in total). The four players of the other team will also play two bowls each (8 in total). During play, the leads, threes and skips will play their bowls in turn, whilst the second of the team of four will play his/her bowls consecutively. The penalty of a 25% reduction in the total score (or for the number of ends the team played one player short) no longer applies. The penalty that is now incurred for being a player short is that that team will put down two fewer bowls that the opposing team for the period of play that the player is absent.

Points 2 and 3, above, are Domestic Regulations, adopted by Bowls Australia, and permissible under the amendments to the relevant laws.

Notes and explanations in relation to the changes to the Laws of the Sport of Lawn Bowls, prepared by Bowls Australia (two separate documents), are available and on display on the on the Pennant noticeboard under the television in the bar. Each of the documents are so displayed as to enable interested members to remove them to read. It is requested that after reading they are returned to the board for the convenience of other members.

The Board of Management has agreed to purchase a copy of Crystal Mark 3 for each of the Club's accredited umpires. Copies are not yet available.

GREENS REPORT

Advice has been received from Tas Turf Solutions that a build up of thatch in our outdoor greens is the cause of moisture retention and their continued softness, due to the thatch build up hindering the drying process. A program of scarifying, to thin out the thatch, as well as grooming, has commenced but this cannot be too aggressive because of the risk of putting the greens under too much stress. The scarifying/grooming program is setting a foundation for future years, which will produce annual improvements in playing conditions, eventually getting the greens back to the standard preferred by the Club's members.

SATURDAY PENNANT ACTION GROUP

The following is an extract from the January, 2015 edition of the Bowls Tasmania South Newsletter, and is published here for the interest and information of all Kingborough Bowls Club members:

"A Saturday Pennant Action Group was recently established as a consequence of the Bowls Tasmania South decision to establish non-gender specific Saturday Pennant in 2014-2015. the Group is made up of representatives of up to ten clubs who attended a meeting at the Black Buffalo Hotel and is pressing for a return to the previous Saturday format of conducting both a Men's Pennant and a Mixed Pennant. The Group has approached clubs with a survey seeking views of members as to their preferences for the 2015-2016 season. The Saturday Pennant Action Group has not approached BTS and its activities including the survey are not condoned by the BTS Board. The BTS Board has already agreed that non-gender specific pennant will be reviewed at the end of the season."

The above article would indicate that the "survey" currently doing the rounds does not have "official" status and will have no effect on BTS policy, in regard to the format of Saturday Pennant for the 2015-2016 BTS pennant season.

There are a number of concerns that are raised by the circulation of the current "unofficial survey", the most important being that many members of the clubs at which the "unofficial survey" has been on display, and members requested to express their views, may not be so inclined to participate in the **official BTS survey of Saturday Pennant structure** went it finally appears in their clubs. This will not be helpful for either Bowls Tasmania South, or bowling members.

Furthermore, there will be a number of clubs where the "unofficial survey" may not be made available to the members. This will cause the distinct possibility of the data obtained by the Saturday Pennant Action Group, through its "unofficial survey", to be slewed to an inevitable result (e.g. a majority supporting a return to the previous structure of Saturday Pennant [the 2013-2014 model]). Even in those clubs where the "unofficial survey" has been circulated amongst the members, there will be a number of members who will not participate, again adding to the problem of the lack of quality of the data that will be produced by the "unofficial survey".

Whilst it is acknowledged that the non-gender format of the BTS 2014-2015 non-gender specific Saturday Pennant has caused great angst, pain and loss for many "traditionalist" male bowlers, vigilante, non-approved actions by groups such as the Saturday Pennant Action Group will do more harm than good for their cause, and will not be the catalyst for a reversal of the BTS decision. It would be in the best interest of all parties if we all wait for the opportunity to express our views regarding the structure of BTS Saturday Pennant

until BTS issues its extensive 2014-15 season review.
